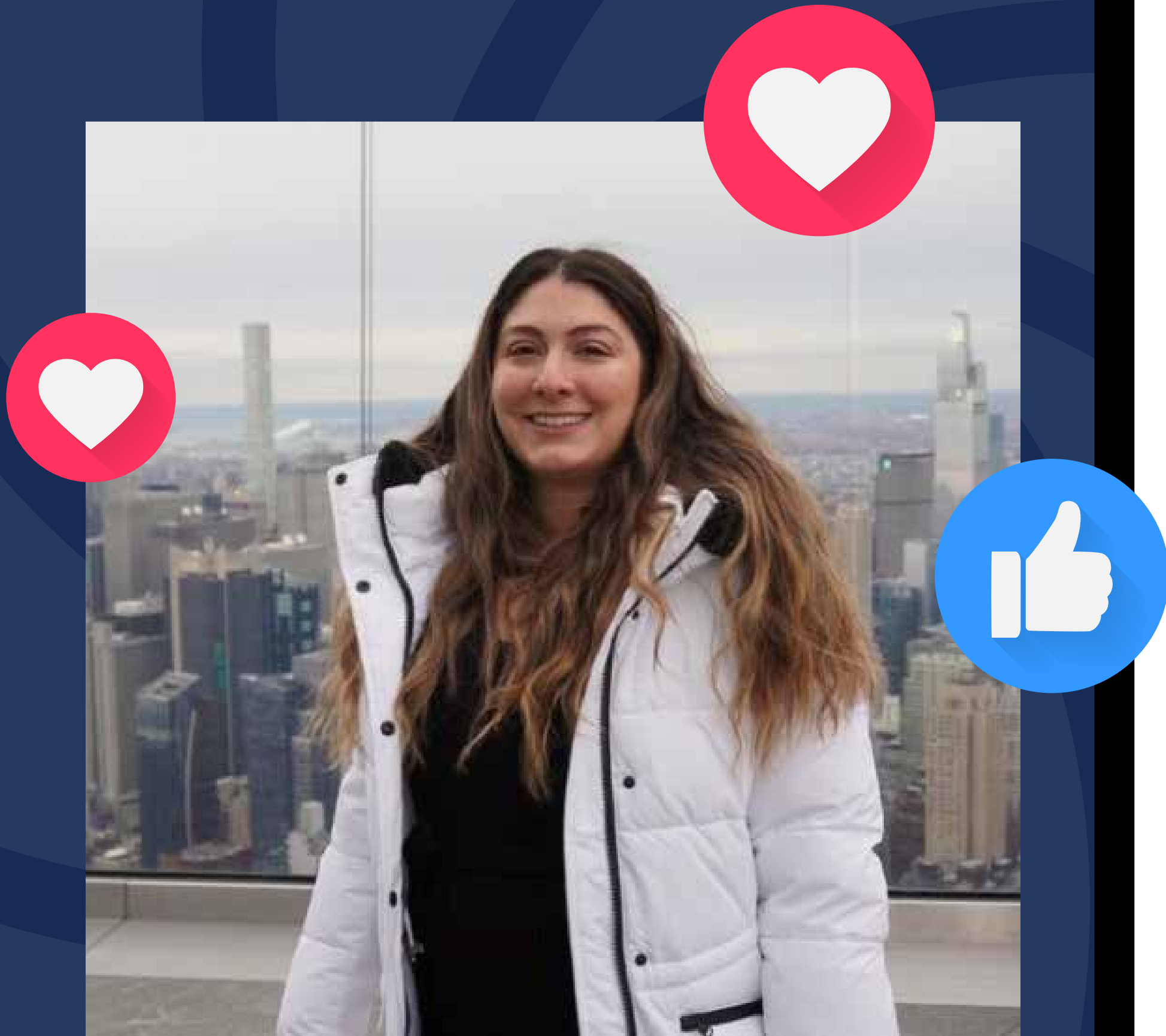

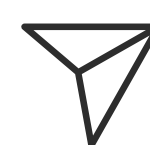

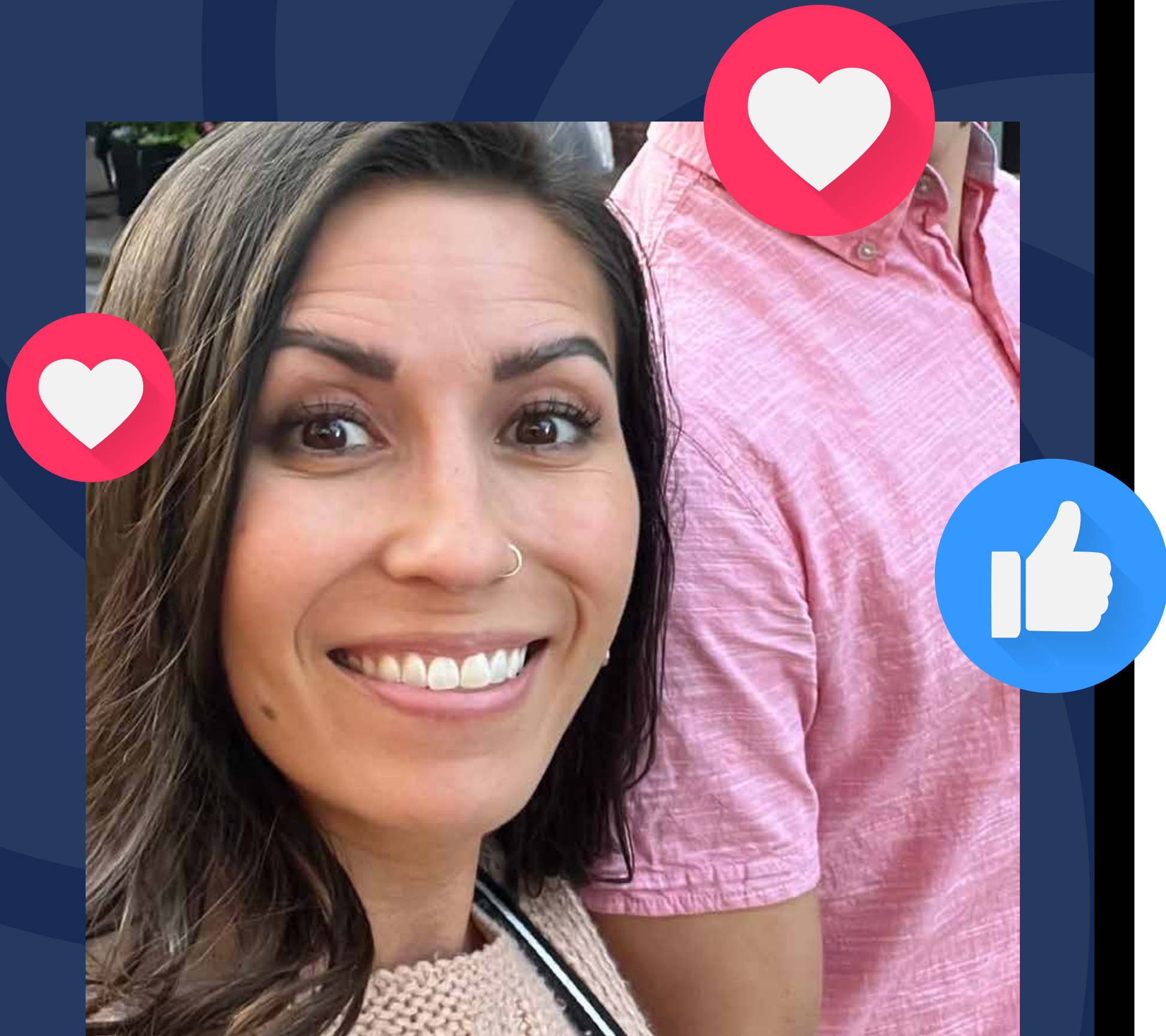
Esmeralda Vaughn is a new member of region 4 and an experienced hydrologist. She also has a master's in earth systems science and environmental engineering.
